## PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO POLICY

This policy is to ensure photography and video footage taken within Radlett Cricket Club is done so appropriately.

The Club believes parents, guardians and carers should not be prevented from taking pictures of, or filming, their children. These are normal family practices and help mark milestones in a child's life. The introduction of proportionate controls on the use of photographic equipment (cameras, and videos, including mobile phones) is part of our general safeguarding good practice in the Club.

For the avoidance of doubt, this policy also applies to live broadcasts on social media or other platforms.

#### **POLICY**

#### General

- Photographs/images/ filming are not to be taken at matches or training without the prior permission of the parents/carers of the child.
- Parental consent to Photographs / images / filming will be granted/or not as part of the Players Membership Registration Form
- If consent has not been given for a child, then it is to be made known to all relevant persons within the club including the appropriate person/s taking photographs / images so that they can avoid taking photographs of that particular child.
- Where the child is playing in a match the coach / team manager of the opposition must be made aware so that not photographs / images of that particular child are taken
- Permission can be given by proxy by the coach, team manager or cricket committee only after parental consent for this has been granted.
- Where photographs / images are to be taken then the children should be informed of this and that if they have concerns they, or there parents / carers, can report these to the coach or team manager
- Any concerns regarding inappropriate, or intrusive, photography / filming should be reported to the Club Welfare Officer and recorded in the same manner as any other child protection or safeguarding concern

# Use of images of children by the Club (for example on the website, handbooks, social media platforms)

- As per the general policy Parental consent will be granted/or not as part of the Players Membership Registration Form to use their child's image on the club website etc.
- For specific images i.e. individual or non team pictures the Club will ask for parental
  permission to use the child's image and, wherever possible, show the image to the
  parents and child in advance. The Club will also ask for the child's permission to use their

image. This ensures that they are aware of the way the image will be used to represent cricket and the club

- If the cricketer is named in an article their photograph should not be used
- If a photograph is used the child will not be named
- Only images of children in appropriate kit, to reduce the risk of inappropriate use, and to provide positive images of the children will be used.
- If anyone feels there is an inappropriate use of images of children then they are encouraged to report their concerns to a Club's Safeguarding Officer

### Using Video / Streaming as a coaching aid or live broadcast:

- Video or streaming equipment may be used as a legitimate coaching aid
- Where live streaming takes place then Parents / Carers will provide consent by way of a specific Live Streaming consent from. For players between the ages of 16 and 18 the player will counter sign with their parents / carers
- Players and parents/carers should be made aware that Video / Streaming is occurring and part of the coaching programme or live broadcast
- Any material taken in connection with coaching / live streaming must be stored securely
  and deleted or destroyed when a parent requests this, or when the material is no longer
  needed.
- The parents/carers will provide written consent for the use of photography and video analysis as part of the Player Membership Registration Form

• All personal data is processed by the Club in accordance with GDPR principles, and other relevant legislation and guidance.
